MISSION TO CHINA Sep 12 to 22, 2012

Trip Itinerary (Tentative)

Day 1 9/12 Toronto/Beijing

Check in at Toronto International Airport for an afternoon flight HU7976 by 5:20pm to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. Cross the International Dateline.

Day 2 9/13 Beijing (King Wing Hotel/5-Star, 17 Dongsanhuan Rd. S., Tel: 86-10-67668866)

Arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 6:50pm. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport. Transfer to the hotel.

Day 3 9/14 Beijing

Visit the Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world. Sightseeing also includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms, and the Summer Palace, known for many significance such as the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen- Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

Day 4 9/15 Beijing

Tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, the 4,000-mile long and 2,000 years old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by naked eye from the moon. Visit to the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner.

Day 5 9/16 Beijing

Visit Lama Temple and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D., where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest.

Day 6 9/17 Beijing/Shanghai/Suzhou (Glamor Hotel/4-Star, 6 Tong4ingbei Rd., Tel: 86-512-65338811)

Morning China Hainan flight 11:10am/1:10pm to Shanghai, then take the tour bus trip to Suzhou. Afternoon sightseeing to the centuries old Linger Garden.

Day 7 9/18 Suzhou

Sightseeing includes Tiger Hill and Hanshan Temple. Visit to the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, an important local craft with 1,000 years history. Evening Dinner Show of the traditional Chinese Music.

Day 8 9/19 Suzhou/Hangzhou (Regal Hotel/5-Star, 370 Gym Rd., Tel: 86-571-56199999)

Morning bus tour journey to Hangzhou. Visit to Economic Development Zone. Visit to the centuries old Lingyin Temple, with the main feature of the 64.3 ft-high camphor-wood carved Buddha.

Day 9 9/20 Hangzhou/Shanghai Guangdong Hotel/5-Star, 328 Yixian Rd., Shanghai, Tel: 86-21-51171888)

Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Afternoon tour bus trip to Shanghai.

Day 10 9/21 Shanghai

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocky works and over arching trees. Visit to the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone.

Day 11 9/22 Shanghai/Toronto

You may take the morning flight 8:45 am/10:45am to transit at Beijing then HU7975 at 1:55 pm for Toronto where you will arrive at 3:10 pm on the same day.

Day 1 through Day 5 - The same itinerary for arrival and touring Beijing.

Day 6 – Take a morning flight to Xi'an, stay at Grand Castle Hotel. Enjoy afternoon sightseeing at the Big Wild Geese Pagoda. The evening entertainment will highlight Tang Style Dancing.

Day 7 – In the morning board the bus for an excursion to the Terra-Cotta Warriors at the Tomb of the First Emperor of Qin Dynasty. On the way back, visit the Huaqing Hot Spring Park and Banpo Museum, a preserved pre-historical cavemen site.

Day ____ through Day 11- Flight to Shanghai and the same itinerary like everybody else.

Additional Price: The cost is \$675 Canadian per person in addition to the base fare per person for the Regular Itinerary. The single room supplement is the same as the regular trip.

NOTE: If taking the Xi'an tour, you will be on a different bus from the group doing the regular Itinerary for whole journey. As this is GROUP TRAVEL, we require at least 10 passengers to do the regular trip and 10 passengers to sign up for the Xi'an side trip.



OPTIONAL TOURS - Beijing

Hutong Tour in Beijing (USD \$35/pp)

Hutong is a traditional living area for ordinary Beijing citizens, the history of which dates back to 1000 years ago. Hundreds of thousands of houses of traditional architecture style are densely flanked on both sides of narrow and zigzag streets in which people have been living a peaceful and traditional life there through many generations. Tourists will first get on a traditional rickshaw, two for each, for a Hutong tour, riding through those narrow streets tracing the past of the historical life of an oriental country. Afterwards, tourists will visit local families interviewing their life and cooking Chinese dumplings with the family members. During lunch time, tourists will be served with delicious Chinese domestic dishes and the dumpling tourists make. During the two hour Hutong tour tourists will learn a lot of China's modern life and its people. It is another highlight after the Great Wall.

**People who are not going on the tour will be transferred to local restaurant for lunch and a rest.

Peking Opera (USD \$20/pp or USD \$40/pp for VIP seating)

Peking Opera is the masterpiece of China's traditional culture and art and it is born in Beijing. Until today it is more than three hundred years old. The Opera lasts an hour and thirty minutes, covering several different plays, of which some are full of fighting and some traditional singing and dancing. The show is beautiful for its colorful costumes, impressive facial designs and staging style of oriental culture.

**People who are not going on the show will be transferred to hotel for a rest after dinner.

The Legend of Kung Fu (USD \$25/pp)

The Legend of Kung Fu is the a production which combines the elements of Kung Fu, story-telling, acrobatics, modern dance, and original music to celebrate the philosophy and skill of martial arts. The show tells the story of a young boy, Chun Yi (the pure one), who in order to pursue spiritual and physical harmony is apprenticed as a monk to learn Kung Fu. Along the way he overcomes obstacles, is distracted and tempted, but ultimately achieves the designation of master who will enlighten the younger generations. Invited by Canada's most experienced cultural brokers, John Crompton of Great World Artists, 'Chun Yi: The Legend of Kung Fu' had its first North America tour from August 2005 to January 2006. During that time, it played 150 performances in Vancouver, Toronto, Reno and other North American cities and won enormous audience admiration.

Suzhou, Hangzhou and Shanghai

SUZHOU CANAL CRUISE (USD \$25/pp)

It will be over one hour boat ride on the canals. That will be quite an experience for you. Part of the cruise will be on the ancient Grand Canal, which was dug up over 1,300 years ago. This Grand Canal with a total length of 1,100 miles is the longest man-made canal in the world, far longer than the Suez Canal and the Panama Canal. It is one of the two most famous engineering feats in China. And part of the cruise will be on the smaller side canals in the old part of the city. This will be the most interesting part of the cruise. Since you can not only see the water country view with old arched bridges and old houses on the two sides of the canal, which this city is famous for, but also you will get a firsthand view of what life is like living on the canal. Laundry hanging on lines to dry, children playing and waving, potted plants bathing in the sun and women doing laundry in the canal are common sights along the canal. Half way on the cruise you will also make a stop in the old part of the city to explore the real life of the ordinary people. There is a local market there, and you will have the chance to see a lot of interesting things of the daily life of the local natives. That will also be a fun experience. The canal cruise will be charming and is often called "Venice of the East".

EVENING SHANGHAI ERA SHOW (USD \$35/pp)

The audience will be subject to the stimulation of vision, wind, smoke, odor, surround sound and the effect of light or no light...making them become a show participants. SHANGHAI MAGLEV TRAIN (USD \$25 Round Trip)

Shanghai Maglev train, the first and the only commercial rail line of its type in the world, links Metro Line 2 at Longyang Road with the Pudong International Airport by a train traveling at top speed of 431 kilometers per-hour which is much faster than the Bullet Train in Japan. Shanghai Maglev Train takes only 7 minutes and 20 seconds to cover 30 kilometer trip, which currently takes 30 to 40 minutes by driving. Invested with a total amount of 10 billion yuan, it took 2.5 years to complete. This train is powered by electromagnetism, when running it is suspended in the air, about 10 millimeters above the track on a magnetic cushion. It brings a speed revolution to the world in ground transportation, and riding on the train will be an exciting experience for you!

SHOPPING FOR FAMOUS CHINESE ARTS & CRAFTS

● *Beijing*

Jade Factory: China is rich in its jade resource, therefore jade and its cultural impact to Chinese people and later on to Asians has been historical. Tourists will get a chance to visit Beijing Jade Carving Factory which so far is the biggest jade collection in China. Tourists will find hundreds of thousands of precious jade, jadeites and handmade jade carvings, the raw material of which come from Northeast and the Silk Road area of China.

Pearl Farm: The Pearl shop in Beijing has been exhibiting a rich variety of home produced sea pearls and fresh water pearls due to both the historical reason and the modern market. Among them, the king and queen size pearls are really of precious quality. The type of Pearl Powder on sale was first contributed to Qing Dynasty Royal Family as a cosmetic, and they can be found here too.

Ming and Qing Dynasty Furniture: It is an Ancient Furniture Fair. Apart from the antique furniture, there is also a lot of newly made furniture of Ming and Qing Dynasty style to be found in the fair. Shipping is available.

Cloisonné Factory: Born in Beijing 300 years ago Cloisonné is the kind of handmade arts and crafts article used a great deal by royal family and rich families in the past. Now it is popular for everybody. Tourists will visit the workshop to see how the beautiful articles are made with their own eyes. The gorgeous design, handcrafted workmanship and great variety make cloisonné articles very attractive to both domestic and overseas tourists.

● *Suzhou*

Suzhou Embroidery Institute: It is a state owned handicraft research institute. Among the products, the hand-made double-sided embroidery articles in vivid colours of pets and flowers are really gorgeous.

Suzhou Silk Factory: The factory produces one fifth of the country's silk products. The beautifully designed silk clothes and its model show of the factory make it a real attraction to tourists. Silk quilts of different sizes are specially produced for sale here.

● *Hangzhou*

Hangzhou Dragon Well Tea Farm: The Dragon Well Tea planted in this village was once only available to the Chinese Royal Family. It is a famous brand of Tea in China. Through viewing the Tea Farm and the tea lecture given by the local farmer, tourists will find their visit both enjoyable and healthy.

● *Shanghai*

Shanghai Carpet Mill: Superior quality silk tapestries of all kinds and sizes are produced in the Shanghai Carpet Factory. The hand-made silk tapestries of 400 to 600 knots per square inch are precious purchases.

Tour Fare Includes

International air transportation: Round trip air from designated gateway (Toronto Pearson) per itinerary/departure date. Transportation between your home and the designated gateway, is your own responsibility and not part of the tour fare.

China internal transportation: All intra-China flights are included per itinerary. Private motor coach land travel, private transfers between airport and hotel, and all China domestic transportation within tour are included.

Taxes and Fees: Canadian and China taxes & governmental fees, and fuel surcharges are included.

Accommodations: First class hotel accommodations are included in your tour cost, based on standard twin-bedded rooms with private facilities. Tour fares shown are quoted on a per person double occupancy rate. Rate for triple occupancy is the same as that for double occupancy. Triple room is a twin-bedded standard room adding a rollaway bed. Single occupancy is subject to Single Supplement charge.

Sightseeing & Admissions Fees: Comprehensive sightseeing, West Lake cruise and evening shows including admission/entrance fees are included per itinerary. The arrangements of these programs are determined by local tour operator and are based on local circumstances such as weather, traffic, holidays, holidays etc. **Note: Optional Tours are additional cost to passenger.**

Meals: Daily meals are included as specified in the itinerary. Buffet style American breakfast is served at all the hotels on your trip. Lunch and dinner are usually served in the Chinese "family style" with a set menu including one glass of selected beverage per person.

Escorting/Guiding Services: A professional English-speaking tour guide is assigned to each tour bus to offer local guiding services.

Porterage: Luggage handling services are included throughout China.

Tour Fare Does Not Include

Visa: Each person participating on the trip must obtain a Chinese Visa.

Travel Expense: Between your home city and Toronto Pearson International Airport.

Gratuities: The customary gratuities to the tour guides, motor coach drivers, porters and wait staff are not included in the tour price. Instead, a one-time gratuity of \$25 US Dollars for each passenger will be collected during the trip. **(Note that for exceptional service, additional gratuities may be collected for the Tour Guide and the Bus Driver – the amount to offer is solely at the passenger's discretion).**

Personal Items: Laundry, room service, phone charges, excess baggage charges, optional tours, and insurance premiums, as well as any items or services not specifically listed in the itinerary are not included.

Tour Fare Validity

All tour fares shown are based on the current value of the Chinese (Yuan) RMB in relation to US Dollar as of March 1, 2012 (1USD = 6.7 RMB), and are subject to change. Should US Dollar devalue by 10% or greater to Chinese RMB, Citisinc reserves the right to increase tour prices accordingly. This applies to all tour payments including those that have been paid in full.



Passenger Information

Passengers are responsible to ensure that the Centre Wellington Chamber of Commerce is provided with correctly spelled name, credit card billing address, mailing address, email and phone data for each passenger. Names provided must match exactly the first and last names that appear on the passport. Failure to do so will result in denial of boarding.

Deposit

A non-refundable deposit of \$300 Canadian Dollars per person is required to secure your reservation. Payment is to be made by Visa or MasterCard.

Final Payment

Final full payment by Visa or MasterCard is due to Centre Wellington Chamber of Commerce by Friday, June 22nd, 2012. Your reservation is subject to cancellation if final payment is not received by this due date and your Deposit will be forfeited.

Should the traveler(s) cancellation change the room configuration and thereby incurs a single supplement charge to a roommate the amount of charge will be deducted from the travelers' refund. This is in addition to any other cancellation fees that may apply. To receive any refund, all air tickets and all other travel documents must be returned to Citslinc. Applicable refunds will be processed promptly following receipt of the written cancellation and documents. Travel Documentation

All foreign nationals traveling to mainland China must travel with a valid passport and a Chinese Visa obtained prior to entering the country. Any passengers participate the trip with Citslinc have to take care of the passport and visa on their own responsibilities.

Itinerary Changes

The world of travel is ever-changing. Therefore, the day-by-day itinerary is preliminary and subject to adjustment and change. A final verified itinerary will be sent to the Centre Wellington Chamber of Commerce approximately two weeks prior to the departure. Every effort will be made to follow tour itinerary precisely, however unforeseen situations do occasionally occur. If a hotel or flight in the itinerary becomes unavailable, we reserve the right to make substitution with hotel/flight of equal standard and quality. There will be no refunds for any difference in the cost of those accommodations.

Baggage

Baggage is carried at passenger's risk and baggage insurance is recommended. Baggage allowance for transpacific flight is two pieces of checked baggage per person. Total dimensions (Length + Width + Height) of the two pieces must not exceed 107 inches (273cm); maximum dimensions of single piece shall not exceed 62 inches (158cm). Maximum weight per piece is 50 lbs and total weight of the both pieces is not



to exceed 70 lbs. Each passenger may carry one hand baggage, the dimensions of which shall not exceed 45 inches (115cm).

Baggage in excess of allowances will incur excess baggage charge payable on site by the passenger. Your luggage should be limited to one large checked suitcase and one small carry-on bag per person. Valuables, breakable items, travel documents and medications must be carried personally in a hand baggage.

Documents

California Seller of Travel

Citslinc is a Registered Seller of Travel in the State of California. As Citslinc is not a Travel Industry Council of Ontario (TICO) member, if non-delivery of the services purchased, then the passenger would seek redress through the credit card company which was used to purchase the service.

Legal Responsibility

Citslinc acts only as independent contractors acting on behalf of neither the customer (herein referred to as "you") nor the travel suppliers. As a tour operator, Citslinc organizes and sells tour programs consisting of certain services, including air, surface, and water transportation, hotel/cruise accommodations, sightseeing excursions and other package programs that Citslinc purchases or reserves from various suppliers (herein referred to as "Suppliers"). Citslinc does not own nor operate any of these Suppliers.

The Suppliers providing travel services for Citslinc are all independent contractors, and are not agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of Citslinc. As such, Citslinc cannot be held responsible for any negligent or willful act of any supplier or of any third party.

The passage contracts in use by the Suppliers such as airlines, cruise lines, motor coach lines, rail companies, local land operators, hotels and other travel providers whose services are included in your tour package, when issued, shall constitute the sole agreements between you and such third party suppliers, and are subject to the terms and conditions specified by each individual supplier. Citslinc assumes no responsibility for any itinerary changes imposed by the airlines or China local tour operator.

By utilizing the services of the Suppliers, you agree that you will look to such Suppliers for any disputes, accident, property damage or personal loss to you or to those traveling with you, and that neither Citslinc nor any representative of Citslinc shall be liable.

In the event of cancellation, alteration or substitution of such services due to the operation of the Suppliers, delays, weather, act of government authority or other causes of whatever nature beyond the control of Citslinc comparable services would be offered; and, there shall be no refund or penalties in this connection. Citslinc reserves the right to decline to accept, or retain any person as tour member if such person's physical or mental conditions, in our opinion, impede the operation of the tour. Citslinc reserves the right to cancel the tour prior to departure for any reason. Liability for such cancellation is limited to full refund of money received by Citslinc. Doing so will constitute full settlement with the tour member.

Airlines, motor coach and other transportation carriers concerned shall not be liable for any act, omission or event during the time the passengers are not on board their planes or conveyances.
